Speaker bios

Pavlína Kvapilová is an independent consultant, producer, and presenter. Among many other activities, Pavlina is running her own multimedia project called Elegantní Česko (Elegant Czechs). The aim is to revive the best of what the country and its people once knew. She is the former director of the New Media division at Czech Television (the public broadcaster) and also served as head of special coverage at the all-news channel CT24 and participated widely in the creation of innovative programs such as the interactive prime-time show Hyde Park CT24. Pavlina was Czech Radio's correspondent in Brussels (2003-2005).

Alastair Reid is a journalist specializing in social media newsgathering and digital verification. Until recently he was managing editor of First Draft, an international non-

profit organization that trains news organizations and journalists in navigating online news. Before that he was editor of Journalism.co.uk, Europe's leading publication on developments in digital journalism.

Jaroslav Shimov has been a journalist with RFE/RL's Russian Service, based in Prague, since 1999. He specializes in Russian foreign policy, Central and Eastern European politics and history, and Russian relations in the region. Shimov was born in Belarus and studied history and journalism at Moscow State University. He has published three books on the history of the Habsburg Empire and its successor states.

Ondřej Soukup has spent his entire professional life dealing with the states of the former Soviet Union, be it in the academic sphere, in the non-governmental sector, or as a journalist. He now works as an editor of the foreign section of Hospodářské noviny, the Czech Republic's leading business daily. He previously worked as the newspaper's Moscow correspondent.

Jaroslav Valuch is project leader at Press Start, a new global crowdfunding platform developed by TOL for journalists in countries where the press cannot work freely. Jaroslav is an expert in media literacy, social media activism, and communication with crisis-affected populations, having worked with dozens of organizations and civic initiatives in Europe, the Middle East, and Southeast Asia. He joined the Budapest Centre for Mass Atrocities Prevention as a senior researcher and recently led a nationwide communications campaign focused on raising awareness about, monitoring, and mapping hate-motivated violence and hate speech, a program organized by the Office of the Government.
